

PLENARY SPEAKERS

Dr. Margaret Cottle is a Palliative Care physician in greater Vancouver, BC, working in Home Hospice Programs, and is a clinical assistant professor at the University of BC medical school. She speaks internationally about end of life issues and palliative care and addressed members of the Canadian Parliament in 2006 and 2017. Dr. Cottle and her husband, Dr. Robin Cottle, an ophthalmologist, sponsor the UBC student chapter of the CMDA Canada, hosting the students weekly for dinner and discussions.

Dr. Tim Ehmann is a Child and Adolescent Psychiatrist residing in the Calgary region. He was trained at the University of Saskatchewan where he obtained his medical degree in 2008 and subsequently completed his psychiatry residency training in 2013. Dr. Ehmann has provided both inpatient and outpatient psychiatric care to children, youth and families over the past 10 years. Currently residing in Alberta, he supports outpatient community mental health services in the Rural South regions of Alberta Health Services. He also provides psychiatric care to adolescents and young adults with intellectual disabilities and autism.

Fr. Christian Mutombo was born in the Democratic Republic of Congo and has been living in Canada since 2014. He came to Canada with a bachelor's degree in philosophy. He spent 8 months studying English at Culture-Work via Saint Peter's Seminary and Western University (Ontario), where he holds a Master of Divinity degree. For the past five years, he has been the master of ceremonies at the Archdiocese of Saint-

Boniface, and for the past three years, he has been the parish priest at Saints Martyrs Canadiens. Father Mutombo is currently pursuing a Licentiate in Liturgy and Sacraments via the Catholic University of Paris.

Dr. Stewart Wakeman is a semiretired psychiatrist who was born and raised in Winnipeg, graduating from the University of Manitoba with an MD in 1981. He went on to achieve a CCFP in 1983 and FRCPC in psychiatry in 1993. His career has been for the most part in community psychiatry and community mental health with a special interest and perspective in psychiatric rehabilitation, post-traumatic disorders, addiction psychiatry. spirituality and mental health, and adult neurodevelopmental disorders. His non-work interests are creating art through watercolours, oil pastels, and coloured pencils, playing guitar, and hiking with his wife Sandra and their 3 grown children.

Larry Worthen is a graduate of Dalhousie Law School (1981) who had a career in management in the not-for-profit sector and Nova Scotia Department of Justice. He is a trained facilitator, adult educator, and mediator. Larry is married to Dr. Linda Gagnon and resides in Dartmouth, Nova Scotia. He is an ordained deacon in the Catholic Church. In May of 2013, he graduated from the Atlantic School of Theology with his MA in Theology and Religious Studies. His thesis outlines the role of proclamation in the New Evangelization. He has been the Executive Director of CMDA Canada since 2012. Larry and Linda have two children, six grandsons and two granddaughters.
